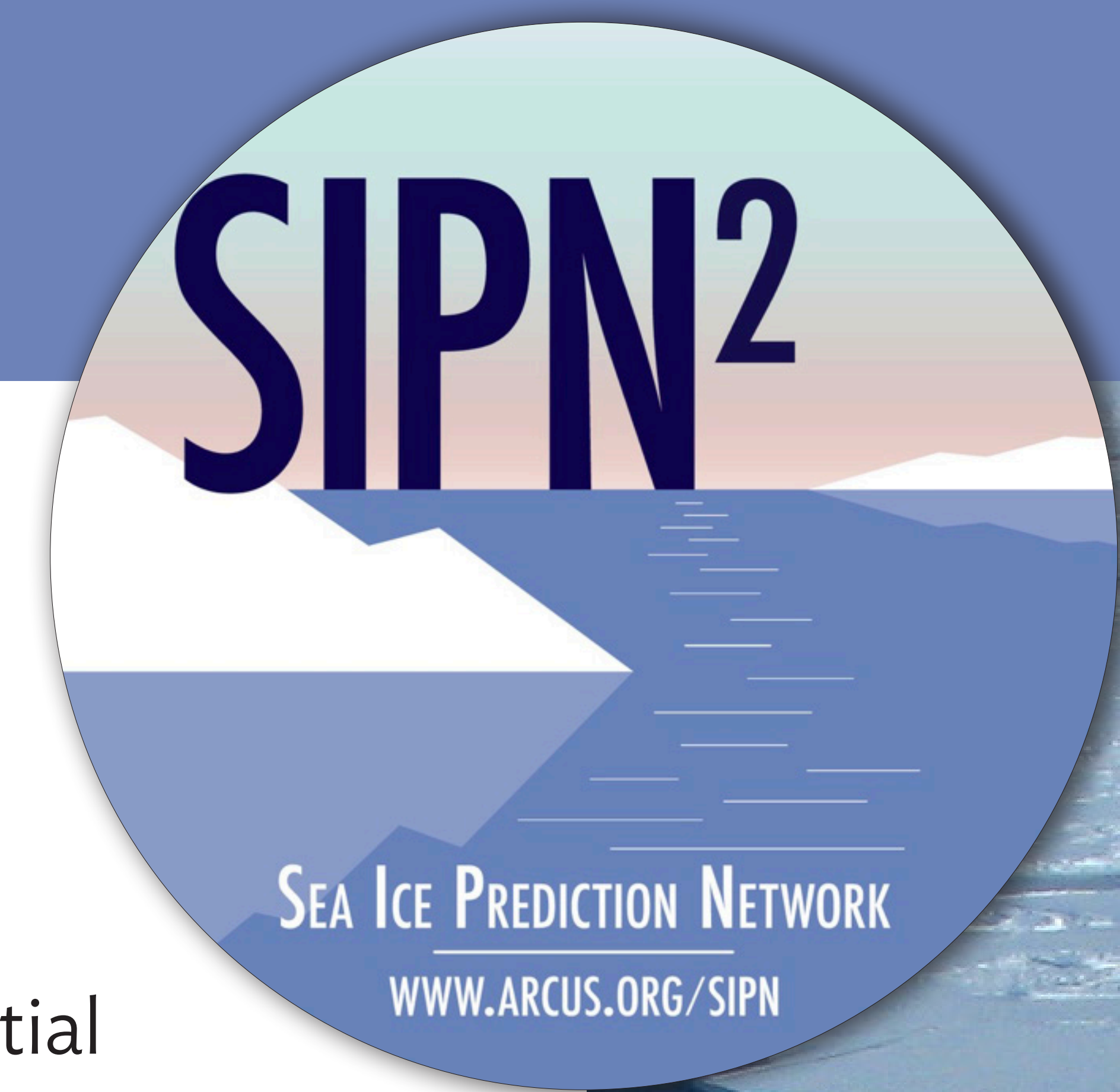


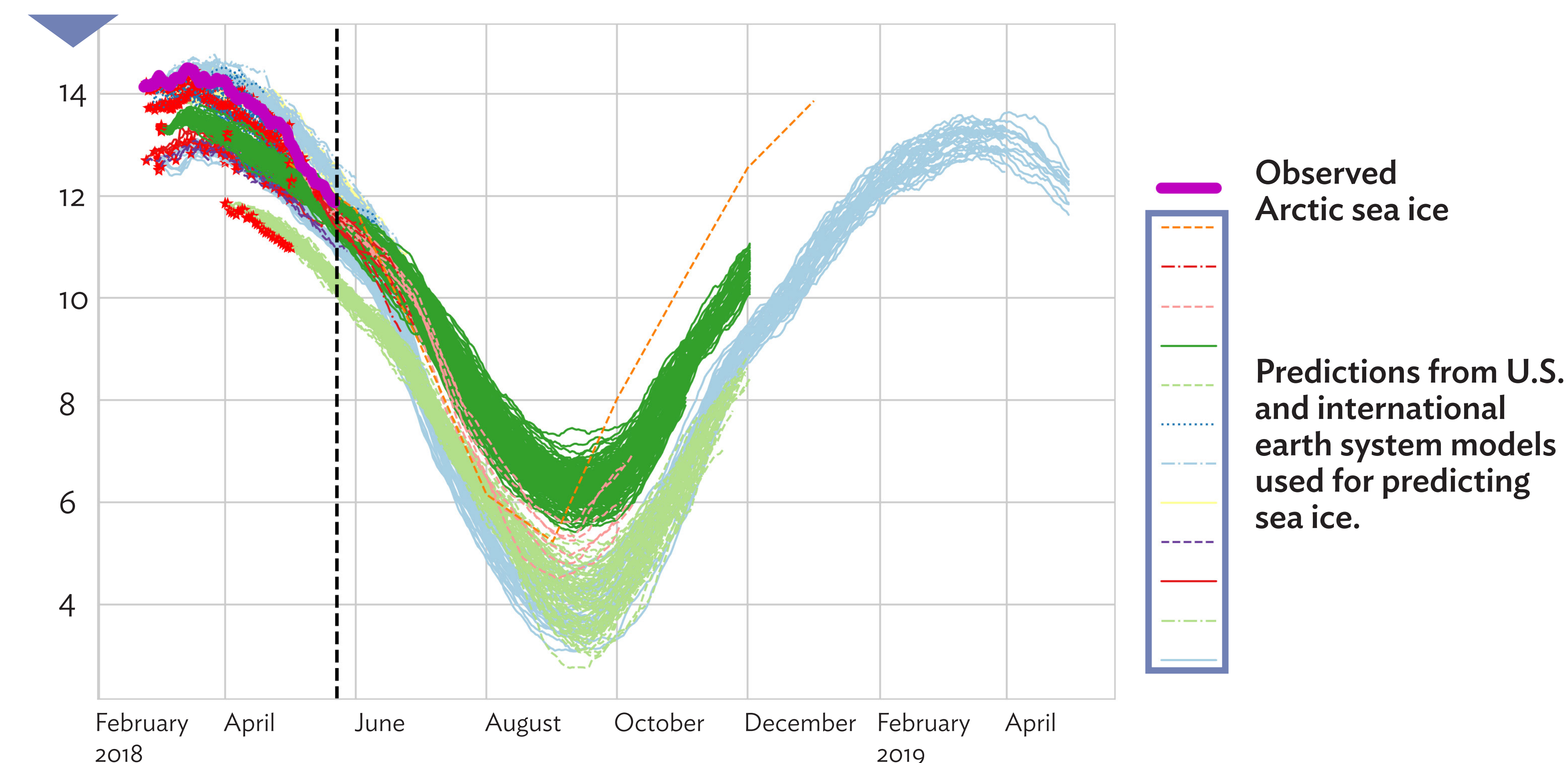
# SEASONAL SEA ICE PREDICTIONS

## A network linking scientists and stakeholders

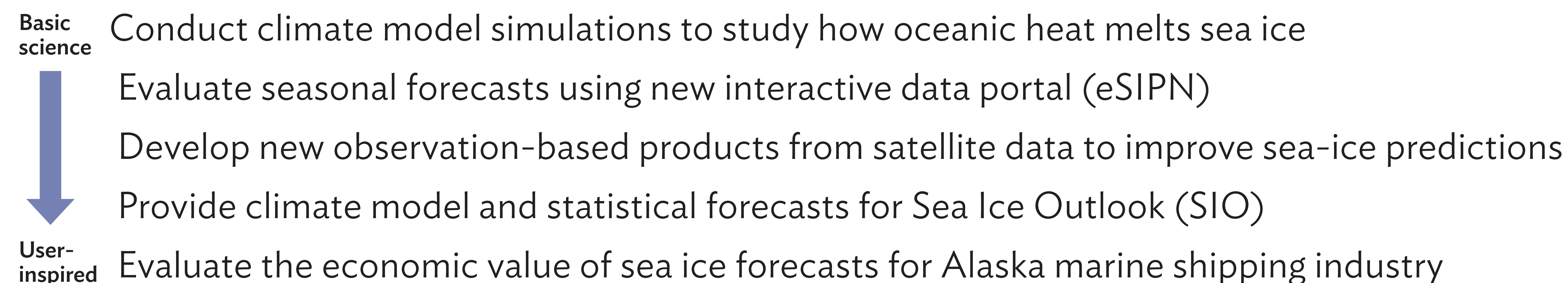
Sea Ice is changing and many different groups need reliable forecasts of sea ice conditions for timeframes ranging from the next two days to six months from now. The Sea Ice Prediction Network (SIPN<sup>2</sup>) takes the best science available based on computer model forecasts to make products that are useful for Alaska stakeholders. It also contributes to scientific advances needed to make more reliable and useful forecasts of sea ice. Communication between scientists and stakeholders is essential to identify products that meet needs and are possible based on the available science.
